

Emancipatory Research Symposium: July 2023

CRESTSprogram is happy to have co-sponsored the Emancipatory Research (ER) Symposium, with The Center for Traumatic Stress Research and the Center for Equity, Justice, and the Human Spirit at Xavier University of Louisiana. The ER Symposium (held in July 2023 in New Orleans, LA) was created to cultivate a space where researchers could come together to share their collaborative work with like-minded researchers and active members of this community. The keynote speakers for the event were Fiona Cram, Ph.D., Kaupapa Maori researcher and evaluator, and Tepora Emery, Ph.D., a Kaupapa Māori researcher, evaluator, and teacher. We were very happy to see one attendee in particular, L'Tonya "Tonnie" Weatherspoon (a consultant with the United Way of Atlanta). Ms. Weatherspoon is a graduate of our CRESTS-Liberate credentialing program and was sponsored by the Broward Educational Research Alliance (BERA) through a Kellogg Foundation grant. We look forward to more graduates of our CRESTS-Liberate credentialing program in attendance at next year's symposium.

Trademark: Community-Stakeholder-Scholar (CSS) Model

Last year, we submitted a trademark application for the term, Community

Stakeholder Scholar (CSS) Model. After nearly of year of waiting, our application was published in the Official Gazette on August 1st by the US Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) as of 9/1/2023. Yay! Next, we should receive a Notice of Allowance sometime in October, just a few weeks away. We are so happy to be able to share knowledge about emancipatory research with community people, non-profit organization staffers, academicians, and others.
