#### **January 21: The Power of Partnerships**

One of CRESTSprogram's most impactful accomplishments of 2024 has been the establishment of our ongoing partnership with Global Health Action (GHA). We have partnered with GHA to provide mental health-related training to their Kenyan partners who have been providing services to communities traumatized by a recent natural disaster (extreme flooding). Provided services have included a combination of didactic and coaching sessions, plus the development of a toolkit for service providers. To date, the CRESTSprogram/GHA partnership has been overwhelmingly successful. It has resulted in numerous positive changes within the GHA Kenyan partners and the organization (GHA) on multiple levels: organizational (climate, mental health policies, service delivery, etc.) and personal levels (individual and interpersonal).

Detailed information about this powerful partnership (purpose, activities, processes, outcomes, and lessons learned), will be provided in an upcoming co-hosted webinar that will highlight the CRESTSprogram/GHA partnership. Panelists for this webinar will include representatives from CRESTSprogram, LLC (Dr. Cirecie West-Olatunji, Dr. Constance West, & Dr. Ebony White) and from Global Health Action (Ms. Wendy Jolley-Kabi, Dr. Charsey Cherry, & Mr. Bwalya Mubanga). Additional professionals from GHA (i.e., Dr. N'faly Keita and Ms. Michelle Argueta) who have made considerable contributions to this partnership will also be in attendance (along with Dr. Kimberlee Bow, of CRESTSprogram).



# to Texas for ESEA 2025!






